



Brown Scarf with Cream Stripe

Yarn: The Rocking Yak, 100% Tibetan Yak Down Yarn, one 140yd/100g ball of brown and one 70yd/50g ball of cream.

(Alternatively, you can use one half of 140yd/100g ball of cream and use the other half of the ball to make a **Butterfly Headband**.)

Gauge: 15 sts and 22 rows = 4" [10 cm] in stocking st.

Needles: Size 5.5 mm (US 9) needles

This pattern can also be made with smaller needles (5mm) to create tighter stitches and more warmth. Substitute colours to match your wardrobe.

Instructions

Use intarsia knitting to create a scarf that is reversible and doesn't have holes. Start with 3 small balls of brown and 2 small balls of cream for easier knitting. As you cast on stitches and when knitting each row, twist the yarns around each other, usually picking up the new colour from beneath the colour you have just used.

Cast on 10 sts of brown, then 4 sts of cream, 6 sts of brown, 4 sts of cream, and 10 sts of brown. Total of 34 sts.

Row 1: *K1, P1; repeat from * to end, changing colours to match the previous row.

Row 2: *P1, K1; repeat from * to end, changing colours to match the previous row.

Repeat these 2 rows until the scarf is desired length (approx. 55-60"/140-150 cm) ending with row 2.

Cast off, matching the colours with the previous row. Sew ends into the matching colour.
